o understand the weather in Sri Lanka travelling in the school holidays. The mountainous middle is mostly cooler, and





February brings more dry and warm weather, making it an ideal month to travel. Beaches across the




country will be sun-drenched and there is very small chance of rain as Sri Lanka is now well into the dry season. The highlands are slightly cooler in the evenings, but still dry and warm with good trekking conditions. Temperatures across the country will increase to around 28°C average.

off the early mornings and evenings. Beaches on both sides of the island are dry, hot and sunny.


The good news continues with plenty of sunshine and hot temperatures across the country in March. Temperatures continue to rise into the 30s and the likelihood of rain is very low. This is one of the best months to visit tea country and the hills as the weather really warms up, taking the chill





Arguably the driest and hottest month of the year, April starts to get very hot (too hot for some), especially in the central and Cultural Triangle regions, with temperatures at least in the mid-30s. It's a great month to head to the beach, with clear skies and long, sunny days. Make sure to avoid the hot-

test hours of the day (11am-3pm) when sightseeing during April.



August

September

The first inter-monsoon month, July, sees the end of the south-east monsoon and moves into drier weather. Over the years the monsoons have been known to come early or run late, so sometimes July can catch the tail end of the rains. To be safe, travel towards the middle and end of July where there is less chance of short, sharp showers. The east coast is the driest at this time of year, but the south is still good with lots of sunshine days and only a small chance of the odd shower.

August is still inter-monsoon season, meaning that, sparing the odd shower, the weather is great at this time of year. Temperatures remain high across the country at around 29°C average and the

As the inter-monsoon period continues, expect nice dry weather and warm temperatures across Sri Lanka. The likelihood of rain is low and with temperatures firmly around 29°C, it's a great time to visit. The larger north-east monsoon is just around the corner, and in the past has been known to arrive earlier in September, so the tail end of the month can sometimes experience a slightly increased

amount of rain.





December The weather in December generally depends on when the north-east monsoon ends. It can be a great month to travel if the rains tail off at the end of November, with nice, hot and dry weather

across the island. The rains will also have helped thicken out the lush green landscapes, making it an exceptionally beautiful time to enjoy the rural parts of Sri Lanka. Traditionally it's not monsoon time, but very occasionally the rains will continue into December, with a few showers here and there.

November usually sees the north-east monsoon in full swing, which means that most of the country will see some rain. The amount and timing of the rains tends to change year on year, with pockets of
